IAPT (Improving Access to Psychological Therapies) provides support with mild to moderate depression and/or an anxiety disorder for patients aged 18 and over. The IAPT team is made up of staff who provide a service for people with common mental health problems, enabling them to acquire the skills they need to promote their own recovery.

Substance to Solution (S2S)

Patient on Line Services

GP online services allow you to access a range of services via your computer or mobile device. Once you have signed up, you will be able to:

Everyone who is registered with a GP can have access to their practice's online services. There has been extremely good feedback from patients who use this service. How can we improve access to general practice services?

Care Navigation / Sign Posting

When you contact the practice you will be asked some questions by a trained Care Navigator who will help to ensure that you see the right professional for your needs, which is not always the GP. Please be assured that if you need to see the GP you will still see the GP.

There may be a settling in period for this new service, we ask for your support and patience whilst this takes place. Hopefully you will then begin to see improvements accessing the primary care services you need now and in the future.
